CAMBRIDGE TREES



Come and celebrate Cambridge's magnificent street trees, the start of National Tree Week and the planting of the first four trees of a community scheme. Hills Road residents are supporting Cambridge City Council's scheme to plant 44 new street trees in the grass verges along Hills Road. Two species were chosen, a Zelkova (*Zelkova serrata* 'Green Vase') and a Persian ironwood (*Parrotia persica* 'Vanessa'). Both are known for their autumnal colours and will brighten the area with dazzling displays of orange and red as they mature to form the backbone of a new generation of trees along Hills Road.

The aim is to ensure an attractive and resilient tree-scape in the long term for Hills Road. Tree canopy cover can also play a significant part in addressing the effects of climate change in an urban setting. Cambridge City Council is committed to safeguarding and maximising the city's unique urban tree cover and the Council's tree officers are actively looking for ways to involve residents all over the city as tree ambassadors to help them to do this.
